Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your continued support this term. It has been very encouraging to see how positively pupils and families have engaged with our expectations, particularly our gate-to-gate mobile phone rule, which is already improving focus, behaviour and positive social interaction across the school.

Uniform expectations after half term

We are now placing a renewed focus on key aspects of uniform to ensure consistency and high standards. We are seeing an increase in hoodies, leggings, white socks worn over leggings and white trainers, which are not part of the Brynteg uniform. After half term, hoodies will be confiscated if worn in school and returned at the end of the day, although coats are available for pupils if needed. Pupils who arrive in incorrect uniform may be placed in the Ready to Learn Room until the correct uniform is brought in.

If there is a genuine reason why a pupil does not have the correct uniform, they must bring a note from a parent or carer. If you are experiencing financial difficulties, please contact us as soon as possible so we can support you. We kindly ask families to be proactive, as we do not want pupils returning after half term without the correct uniform.

School bags and equipment

All pupils must bring a school bag each day so that phones, if brought into school, can be stored securely and so they can carry their pencil case and learning equipment. Pupils should bring a pen, pencil, ruler, pencil sharpener and rubber each day. Equipment pencil cases can be purchased via ParentPay for £1 or with cash from the Hub.

Attendance recognition

Thank you for your support in promoting strong attendance. Pupils with attendance of 95 percent or above, as well as those with mitigating health or family circumstances this half term, will receive 60 Teggies and a celebration postcard on the first day of next half term.

Thank you again for your continued partnership in supporting high standards and ensuring all pupils arrive ready to learn.
